Things you should know...

Info Booth

An “Info Booth” is on the festival grounds courtesy of the Garnett Area Chamber of Commerce. For assistance, directions, etc., please visit the Info Booth. Special “Welcome” programs will be given at the entrance to the festival, complimentary of *The Advocate* newspaper.

Free Shuttle Bus Service

FREE shuttle bus service is available for visitors throughout the day and evening courtesy of Lybarger Oil, Inc. These shuttle services will take you to all events, activities, food and vendor booths, Concert on the Hill and parking areas. Buses are running throughout the day in the park so if you don't want to walk, ride the bus!

Parking

Parking is available throughout the park in designated areas (see map on website). Be sure to locate the parking lot signs to remember where you parked. Buses will stop at “Bus Stop” signs designated throughout the park.

Handicapped: A handicapped parking area (see map on website) and handicapped accessible bus is also available for persons with special needs. Handicapped parking is limited for those vehicles displaying the handicapped emblem on their license plate or mirror tag. Handicapped port-a-potties are available at the Cornstock Concert on the Hill.

Personal Safety

If you lose someone: In the event you and your child, friends/family become separated at the festival, please talk before hand and pick a designated place to meet – like the Information Booth!

First aid will be available for people that might need assistance (see map on website!).

Police and Security will be accessible throughout the festival and concert areas.

Personal ATV's and golf carts are prohibited throughout the festival and concert area.

Admission

Admission is by wristband. Wristbands are \$30 at the gate. All sales are final. No refunds, exchanges or returns. Cornstock – Anderson County Corn Festival is not responsible for misplaced, lost or stolen wristbands.

Concert Rules:

- Wristbands must be worn at all times in the concert area. Persons not wearing wristbands will be removed from the premises.
- Security and uniformed patrolmen are on-site to ensure safety. If you experience a problem or an emergency, please contact them for assistance.
- All bags and carry-in items will be searched prior to entry of the gates. No food or beverages of any kind are permitted through the gates. Alcohol will not be allowed in or taken out. Vendors will be selling food and drink at the concert.
- The Concert on the Hill features festival style seating with ample room for your lawn chair. Event management reserves the right to ask spectators to remove any items that obstruct viewing or that may be objectionable. Please respect the views of those seated behind you.
- A designated beer area is available and those entering must be 21 years old and show proof if questioned. **NO ONE UNDER 21 IS PERMITTED IN THE BEER AREA.** Beer is to be consumed in that area by those who are wearing an over 21 wristband. Persons may leave and return to the beer area as often as they wish but cannot take alcohol out of the designated area.
- The Cornstock Committee encourages everyone to have a good time and be safe. Please choose a designated driver and drink responsibly.
- Portable restrooms are conveniently placed throughout the concert area. Please help keep the concert area litter free – put your trash in the provided trash receptacles.
- Tailgating or congregating in the North Lake Park outside the concert gates is strictly prohibited.
- Pets are **NOT PERMITTED** on the Concert on the Hill grounds.
- Video or recording devices are prohibited.
- No weapons of any kind, no water guns or laser pointers allowed.

After the Concert:

At the conclusion of the concert please use the free bus transportation provided. To ensure safety no walking on the lake road following the concert as the bus drivers have difficulties seeing pedestrians walking in the dark.

EXITING PARK: When exiting the park following the concert, vehicles will form 2 outgoing lines. Left lane will turn left, right lane will turn right onto Park Road. Park Road will be closed to thru traffic between Pine Street and Oat Street to allow vehicles to exit the park. No vehicles will be allowed to enter the park during this time until the traffic has been cleared from the concert.

LAWS:

All local, state and federal laws are to be obeyed. Patrons under the age of 21 are not permitted to consume any alcoholic beverage while on the Concert on the Hill grounds. Providing a minor with alcohol is also illegal.

Use of illegal drugs, drunken and /or obnoxious activities and other forms of misbehavior will not be tolerated. Anyone found to be in violation of any law or regulation may be subject to prosecution and will be evicted from the event without refund of the ticket.

All persons attending Cornstock, the Anderson County Corn Festival and the activities therein do so at their own risk. No liability is assumed by the Anderson County Corn Festival Committee, its volunteers, the City of Garnett, the County of Anderson, managers, promoters, sponsors or others.
